


Stress Test



1. (analysis) Separating something into its parts to examine it.
2. (breeding birds) Birds who are also breeding and raising their young in the area they are living.
3. (climate) Average weather conditions of a place over a number of years.
4. (conservation) The care and protection of natural resources such as forests and water.
5. (cubic feet) The summed volume of many cubes that are each 1 foot long, 1 foot high, and 1 foot wide.
6. (elevation) The height above sea level.
7. (habitat) Environments where a particular animal naturally grows and lives.
8. (indicate) To point toward; point to.
9. (native) Naturally occurring in an area.
10. (population) The total number of individuals of separate types of plants or animals occupying an area.
11. (publicly) By the government or behalf of all citizens.
12. (range lands) Open lands which are mostly covered with grasses or shrubs.
13. (ratio) The relation of one thing to another in size, amount, etc. Proportion.
14. (relationships) Connections in some fashion of two or more things.
15. (represent) To be an example of.
16. (sediment) Matter set down by wind or water, such as sand or silt.
17. (species) Groups of organisms that resemble one another in appearance, behavior, chemical processes, and genetic structure.
18. (stratified) Stratified, pressurized, or placed under tension.
19. (threatened and endangered spec) Species whose numbers are so low as to threaten or endanger its existence in the future.
20. (variables) Things that can vary in number or amount.
21. (wildlife) Animals that live in the wild.
